Donna M. Bonvenuto, 67, a lifelong resident of Point Marion, passed away Thursday, February 22, 2018, in the Cleveland Clinic, with her family at her side. Born in Morgantown on March 29, 1950, she was a daughter of Florence (Fuss) Bonvenuto, and the late Frank C. Bonvenuto, who died in 2011.

A 1968 graduate of Fr. Kolb High School in Masontown, she was a faithful member of St. Hubert's R.C. Church for all of her life. Donna fought a more than 40 year battle with kidney disease, enduring countless hours and years of dialysis, and three kidney transplants and yet, through it all, she maintained her smile and positive outlook with never a complaint. She was an inspiration to others who were undergoing kidney dialysis, and many of her doctors considered her a medical miracle to have survived, and thrived, through all her ailments.

Donna had a wonderful sense of humor and enjoyed a good laugh, she was a fantastic cook who could make just about anything, she loved her hometown of Point Marion, and she was a strong supporter of the organ transplant program.

Surviving, in addition to her loving mother, are two brothers, Mark Bonvenuto and Frank Bonvenuto, Jr., all of Ohio; two nieces, Ashley Thomas and MacKenzie Bonvenuto; two nephews, Adam Bonvenuto and Zachary

Bonvenuto; several aunts, uncles and cousins; the three Champlin children, who she loved and cared for as her own, Megan Champlin Cerullo, Stephen and Elizabeth Champlin; and many friends and classmates of the Point Marion area. She will be dearly missed by all who loved her.

The family will receive friends in the Richard R. Herod Funeral Home, Philip S. Rishel, Owner and Director, Point Marion, on Monday from 2 - 4 and 7 - 9 P.M., and Tuesday until 9:30 A.M., when a Prayer Service will be held, followed by a Funeral Mass in St. Hubert's R.C.
