“Pa was one of the most talented people I've ever known. He could do mathematical equations in his head and had a gifting for woodworking, architectural designs, and also chemistry in his line of work as a heat treat technician. He loved working on muscle cars and his Ford pickup truck as well as many other cars over the years. I remember working on some of them with him and one time as a toddler I recall him letting me play with the radio knob and cassette buttons in his mustang. As a teenager he refused to let me get my driver's license until I knew all the parts of a car and how to change a tire. He told me his own father would only give him the keys to the family car during snowstorms to teach him how to drive in them and so he felt compelled for my safety to have me learn all about the car as well. He also had a strong standing rule for no work of any kind on Sundays and used his sense of humor to enforce it by saying repeatedly while laughing to all of us, "No sewing on Sunday." Because of his influence with cars I eventually had one of my own cars completely restored which combined with the respect for a rest day on Sunday influenced and prepared me for different areas of ministry where typically women could not relate to the guys but thanks to him I could.

He took me for ice cream and to the driving range and showed me how to putt. He also taught me how to barbecue. And anytime I was sick he would give me a popsicle or a toy to try to make me feel better. He also had a love for anything technical and read science magazines a lot. We used to watch many shows on TV together and to this day I still love watching race cars. He was also a gifted man in sports whether it be baseball, bowling, golf, archery and he even got a hole-in-one. And he was a very generous man and had a great sense of humor and those two traits were the ones that I loved most about my Pa and will never forget.
