Helen (Zvonkovich) Capriotti, 92, of Fairfax Station, Virginia, and a native of Bobtown, Pa., died Saturday, March 23, 2013 at the home of her daughter, following an illness of several months. Born on September 28, 1920 in Allison, Pa., and raised in Bobtown, she was a daughter of the late John and Kata (Hemic) Zvonkovich. A 1937 graduate of Point Marion High School, she worked for a while at Houze Glass in Point Marion. Later, after moving to the Washington DC area, she was employed by the Federal Government until her retirement in 1985. Helen was devoted to her family and treasured her friends. She remained active into her 90's, and often enjoyed playing bingo and the slot machines. Surviving are two daughters, Susan Borinsky and husband, Daniel, of Alexandria, Va., and Joan Lamoy, of Gaithersburg, Maryland; two granddaughters, Marta Borinsky and Jesse Lamoy; two sisters, Pauline Zvonkovich of Fairfax Station, and Anna Heney of Santa Rosa, California; and several loving nieces and nephews. She was beloved and will be missed by all her family, as well as the many people whose lives were made better by knowing her. Deceased are her husband, Louis D.
