January 1, 1753 - February 17, 2011

Rev. Lee Roy Edgell, 77 of Maidsville, W.Va., went home to be with his Lord and Savior on Friday, February 11, 2011. Born Aug. 12, 1933 in Maidsville, he was a son of the late Loman and Sylvia Wagner Edgell. He was an ordained minister since 1967, and was Pastor of The Crusade of Jesus Apostolic Church on U.S. 119 N. outside of Point Marion for the past 10 years. A veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps, he worked for many years in construction and as a self-employed mechanic, and owned and operated Lee's Auto Sales for 20 years. Surviving is his loving wife of 33 years, Clara Sue Faulknier Edgell; three children, Lt. Cpl. Lee Roy Edgell, Jr. and wife Julie, Raymond E. Edgell and wife Wendy, and Sherry Edgell-Downey; four step-children, Bob Cost, Jr., Tammy Cost-Jeffries and husband Dennis, Scott Cost and Timothy Cost; 14 grandchildren, including Lee Roy Edgell, III, who lived with him and was the light of his life; nine great-grandchildren; a sister, Wanda Dewitt and husband Richard of Westover; a brother Calvin Edgell and wife Connie of Cheat Lake, and several nieces and nephews. Deceased are two sisters, Eileen Edgell and Delphia Floyd, and a brother, James Lee.
