Lennie E. Volek, Sr. 69, of Uniontown, Pa., passed away Tuesday, November 28, 2017, at his home following a lengthy illness. Born Sept. 25, 1948 in Morgantown, W.Va., he was a son of the late John J. and Violet (Martin) Volek.

A 1966 graduate of Albert Gallatin High School, he served in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam Conflict. Lennie was a member of St. Hubert's Catholic Church in Point Marion, St. John's Catholic Church in Uniontown, and the Knights of Columbus. He was a steelworker, retired from U.S. Steel's Homestead Plant.

He was the last of his immediate family, having been predeceased by four
