



Morris S. "Baldy" Blosser

April 4, 1929 - March 16, 2012

Morris S. "Baldy" Blosser, 82, a life-long resident of the Stewartstown Community, died Tuesday, March 13, 2012, at his home. Born April 4, 1929 in Stewartstown, he was a son of the late Thomas and Hazel Zearley Blosser. A 1947 graduate of University High School, he was a U.S. Army veteran of the Korean Conflict. "Baldy" was a glassworker, having worked at both Houze Glass in Point Marion and for Fostoria Glass. He retired as a carpenter from City Crane in Morgantown. He loved animals, all his dogs and cats, and especially working with and riding his horses. "Baldy" was well known throughout the area for his skill and love of music. He played the guitar and mandolin, and made many of his own instruments. For over 20 years, he and his fellow "band members" could be found in his garage every Saturday night playing and enjoying their music, which they often performed at area events. Surviving are his two sons, Noland S. Blosser, Sr. and wife Cindy, and Joseph W. Blosser, all of Stewartstown; two grandchildren, Noland Blosser, Jr. and Leann Shriver and husband Greg; two great-grandchildren, Henry and Cadence Shriver; and a sister Verna Gibson of Morgantown. Deceased is his loving wife of 56 years, Betty Lyons Blosser, who died May 16, 2008; two sisters, Polly Harris and Nancy Nicholson; and a brother, Charles. Friends will be received in the Richard R. Herod Funeral Home, Point Marion, Pa., on Thursday from 5 – 9 p.m., and Friday from 11:00 a.m. until 1:00 P.M., the hour of service, with Rev. James Bolen officiating. Interment follows in Mountain View Cemetery, Stewartstown, with Military Honors accorded at the graveside

by the V.F.W. Post 747, and the American Legion, Post 499, both of Point Marion. The family would like to extend their thanks to Sheriff Al Kisner, Sgt.
