Nancy Lee Wilson, 53, a lifelong resident of Masontown, Pa., entered into the presence of her Lord on Tuesday, February 2, 2010, following a long battle with cancer. She had been lovingly cared for at the Henry Clay Villa in Markleysburg by her family and friends through the last stage of her illness. Born in Waynesburg, Pa. on Sept. 6, 1956, she was a beloved daughter of the late James W. Wilson, Sr. and Virginia (Rosie) Wilson.
