



Thomas S. Pellegrini

Thomas Sherwood Pellegrini, 76, of Fairmont, W.Va., died Wednesday, October 22, 2025, in the Ruby Memorial Hospital, Morgantown, following a brief illness. Born in Morgantown on October 13, 1949, he was a son of the late Cheryl McClure Pellegrini and Ralph Pellegrini.

Tom was a veteran of the U.S. Marine Corps, and honorably served during the Vietnam Conflict, including a tour of duty in DaNang, South Vietnam. He was a Police Officer with the Baltimore City Police Department, and, later retired as Chief of Police for White Hall, W.Va., Following his retirement, he moved back to Fairmont.

Surviving are his two sons, Michael Pellegrini of Fairmont, and Steven Pellegrini of Glen Burnie, Maryland, and two grandchildren, Kylie and Cameron Pellegrini.

A son, Christopher Pellegrini, passed away on September 20, 2012.
